

## **WHY HAVE A FIFA FOOTBALL LAW**

#### ANNUAL REVIEW?

Football is currently enjoying a period of unprecedented popularity on the global stage, with the women's game in particular making great strides, both on and off the pitch. This is no coincidence and can be attributed to a number of factors, prime amongst which is FIFA's unwavering pursuit to make the game **truly global under The Vision 2020-2023.** 

In order to achieve this objective, football's legal framework, which faces constant challenges and is subject to continuous updates, is of paramount importance.

Against this backdrop, **FIFA** has set itself the objective of ensuring that football's legal stakeholders are able to gain a first-hand insight into its decision-making processes and their outcomes.

Since 2019, FIFA has opened its doors to its legal stakeholders by hosting the FIFA Football Law Annual Review, which offers an insight into the regulatory work, case law and key decisions taken by its decision making and judicial bodies, as well as the main Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) proceedings arising from FIFA's decisions.

On the pitch, 2023 witnessed the FIFA Women's World Cup™, while off it, world football's governing body oversaw another year of regulatory changes.




#### ATTENDANCE OPTION
